PRESERVATION



400 BC

The Ancient Monuments Protection Act 1882, introduced by Sir John Lubbock, recognises the need for governmental administration for the protection of ANCIENT MONUMENTS. The 68 monuments listed are mostly unoccupied prehistoric structures such as dolmens, stones circles, barrows and pillars.

The Ancient Monuments Consolidation and Amendment Act expands the definition of the monument to "any structure, erection, or monument, of architectural or historic interest". It allows the inclusion of ROMANO-BRITISH AND MEDIEVAL MONUMENTS through the establishment of Royal Commissions.

1953

The National Heritage Act establishes English Heritage as the government's lead advisor on the built environment. The Department of the Environment later removes the 1939 ceiling on listing buildings. It introduces the THIRTY YEAR RULE, by which any building older than this can be considered for listing.

Planning Policy Guidance Note 16
Planning and the Historic Environment

The 2007 revision of the Planning and Policy Guidance of the Historic Environment defines NO LIKELY PERIODS OF INTEREST as absolute. Buildings less than thirty years old can be listed if they are of outstanding quality and under threat.

Prospective?

Prospective preservation predefines a building's status as monument, ensuring a building's longevity and protection even BEFORE IT IS PHYSICALLY MANIFESTED.



● CULTURAL HERITAGE

704 properties

Monuments: Monuments include works of architectural, archaeological, historical, cultural, aesthetic, scientific, ethnological, and archaeological value, or works which illustrate important stages in the history of humanity.

Sites: Sites include areas containing buildings which have cultural or historical importance, their homogeneity which places them in this category, and surrounding environment which provides the point of their meaning, or evidence.

Groups: Groups include the combined works of living and dead, and including the physical and spiritual effects of continuing cultural tradition.

NATURE RESERVE: Areas which contain unique or representative ecosystems under a selective regime.


















The United Nations Human Development Index (HDI) rankings for 2011
